SEXUAL ASSAULT RESOURCES

If you or someone you know has experienced a sexual assault, there are resources and support available. You are not alone.

OPTIONS FOR MEDICAL CARE ALL CONFIDENTIAL

Testing and/or preventative medications for sexually transmitted infections, including HIV, and emergency contraception can be offered.

- UVA STUDENT HEALTH AND WELLNESS (SHW) Call (434) 924-5362 during business hours and request an appointment related to an unwanted sexual encounter. You can also schedule online via HealthyHoos using any appointment reason (such as sexual assault, pregnancy concern, stomach issue, yearly), but please call if a same day appointment is not available. Care at low or no cost is a priority at SHW. Call (434) 297-4291 after-hours.
- UVA EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT (ED) Just go, available 24/7

Options available for evidence collection at SHW and UVA-ED, if chosen

The purpose for evidence collection is to secure and preserve physical evidence should you choose to report to law enforcement. You can make a report later, or never report. The window for evidence collection is 5 days after the incident. You can bring items worn at the time of assault. If possible, don't shower.
